Selman's Creative Craft

To suit bust	81/86 [91/96, 101/106, 111/116] cm 32/34 [36/38, 40/42, 44/46] inches
Finished measurement	86 [96, 106, 116] cm 34 [38, 42, 46] inches
Length	51 [52, 55, 58] cm
Sleeve length (to underarm)	46 [50, 50, 50] cm

Figures in square brackets refer to larger sizes, where is only one set of figures that applies to all sizes.

Materials - AdriaFil Baba 100% pure merino wool
8[9, 10, 11] x 100 gm balls

One pair each 10mm and 12mm needles
Stitch markers

Yarn amounts are given based on average requirements and are approximate

Tension - 8 stitches and 12.3 rows to 10cm (4 inches) using 12mm needles over stocking stitch.

Abbreviations

Stocking stitch	knit 1 row, purl 1 row
k2tog	knit 2 together
ssk	slip the next 2 stitches knitwise one at a time, put left needle through these stitches from left to right in front of the right needle and knit 2 together.
K3tog	knit 3 together
Dec	decrease
Inc	increase
sl1	slip 1 stitch
psso	pass slip stitch over
m1	make 1 by making a backwards loop and putting this loop onto the right needle
RS	right side of the knitting
WS	wrong side of the knitting

Knitting Notes

The knit side is the Right Side of the garment.

Decreases – all decreases except at the cuffs are worked 2 stitches in from the edge and should be worked as follows: RS rows: k2, ssk, knit to last 4 stitches, k2tog, k2

Knit pick up is used to pick up the stitches for the Collar. Hold the piece of knitting you are picking up from in your left hand and a knitting needle in your right hand.

Down the Front edge put the point of the right needle through the knitting between the 1st and 2nd stitch from the edge, take the knitting yarn around the needle as if to knit and make a stitch. To knit pick up from a cast off edge put the point of the right needle under the cast off chain and pick up one stitch for every stitch cast off.

The garment has a wide neckline, so to prevent it from stretching too much the Back, Front and Sleeve neck edges have been cast off.

You may find it easier to use a circular needle for the collar.

Back

With 10mm needles cast on 34[38, 42, 46]stitches

Row 1: k2, *p2, k2* to end of row

Row 2: p2, *k2, p2* to end of row

Continue in k2, p2 rib for 20 rows

Change to 12mm needles and continue in rib for another 10 rows

Change to stocking stitch and continue until the Back measures 36[36, 37, 37]cm

Shape Raglan - cast off 2 stitches at the beginning of next 2 rows. Dec 1 stitch at each end of next and every 4th row 2[2, 1, 2] times and then every 2nd row 4[5, 8, 8] times.

Cast off loosely 18[20, 20, 22]stitches remaining.

Front

Work as for Back until 24[26, 26, 28] stitches on your needle after a RS row.

Next Row: (WS) p5, cast off 14[16, 16, 18] stitches, p5.

Next Row: k2, sl 1, k2tog, psso

Next Row: p3

Next Row: k1, sl1, k1, psso

Next Row: p2

Next Row: k2tog and pull yarn end through stitch to fasten off

With RS facing rejoin yarn to neck edge and continue as follows

Next Row: k3tog, k2

Next Row: p3

Next Row: k2tog, k1

Next Row: p2

Next Row: k2tog and pull yarn end through stitch to fasten off.

Sleeves

With 10mm needles cast on 24[26, 28, 28] stitches

Row 1: k1[2, 2, 1], *p2, k2,* to last 3[4, 4, 3] stitch, p2, k1[2, 2, 1]

Row 2: p1[2, 2, 1], *k2, p2,* to last 3[4, 4, 3] stitch, k2, p1[2, 2, 1]

Continue in rib, work 2 more rows. Dec 1 stitch at each end of next and every 4th row twice - 20[22, 24, 24] stitches. Continue straight in rib until 20 rows in total have been worked.

Change to 12mm needles and continuing in stocking stitch inc 1 stitch at each end of the next and every 4th row 0[0, 0, 3] times, every 6th row 1[2, 6, 4] times and then every 8th row 3[3, 0, 0] times - 28[32, 36, 38] stitches. Continue straight in stocking stitch until Sleeve measures 46[50, 50, 50]cm

Shape Raglan cast off 2 stitches at the beginning of the next 2 rows. Dec 1 stitch at each end of next and every 4th row 2[2, 1, 2] times and then every 2nd row 4[5, 8, 8] times.

Cast off loosely 12[14, 14, 14] stitches remaining.

Collar

With 10mm needles and starting with Front (RS facing you) knit pick up 5 stitches down left Front edge, 14[16, 16, 18] stitches across Front neck, 5 stitches up right Front edge, 12[14, 14, 14] stitches across Sleeve, 18[20, 20, 22] stitches across Back and 12[14, 14, 14] stitches across second Sleeve - 66[74, 74, 78] stitches

Next Row: (WS of garment facing you) k2 *p2, k2* repeat to end of row

Next Row: p2, *k2, p2,* repeat to the end of the row

Work 1 more row of k2, p2 rib

Next Row: knit (fold line row)

Change to 12mm needles and continuing in k2, p2 rib as before work 2 rows placing a stitch marker at the centre of each sleeve. Continue in rib working a m1 at the stitch marker on the next and every 2nd row 9 times. Gradually work the extra stitches into the rib pattern.

Cast off very loosely in rib (you may find it helpful to use a 15mm needle to cast off loosely)

To make up

Join all the raglan seams. Join the Collar seam from the garment edge to 2 or 3 rows past the fold line row if you want a split collar, or join the seam completely if you want to close the collar, remembering the collar has to fold to the right side of the garment. Join the side and underarm seams.
